

## **Showcase G (2025)**

**Built in 1898 in the Chautauqua area of Mt. Gretna, the Inn was the first of Mt. Gretna's three hotels. The Inn, which was located on the site of the current large parking lot south of Route 117, prospered well into the 20th century. It was demolished in 1970.**

**The Hotel Conewago, built in 1909, stood on the hillside on the western end of Lake Conewago. The three-story hotel had 125 rooms, chefs from New York City and such modern conveniences for the time as hot and cold water in all rooms, electric and gas lights and telephone service. The Hotel was sold in 1940 and demolished that same year.**

**Built in the early years of the 1900s, the Kauffman Hotel was located immediately south of the parking lot of the current Hideaway Restaurant in Mt. Gretna. Located just east of the Campmeeting area of Mt. Gretna, the Hotel was the centerpiece of Abraham Kauffman's resort, which was called "The Willows." The Hotel was demolished in the first half of the 20th century.**

## **Showcase H (2025)**

**Gretna Music has grown from its humble beginnings in 1976, when Carl Ellenberger brought musicians together for summer performances, into a nationally recognized cultural gem. Over 50 years, it has hosted 55 Grammy winners (with six more performing this summer) and 2,275 musicians, earning accolades like TIME Magazine's recognition as one of the "Six Best Small Summer Music Festivals." With initiatives like GM4K for kids and First Listen for youth performers, Gretna Music continues to inspire, educate, and unite the community, ensuring its legacy for generations to come.**
